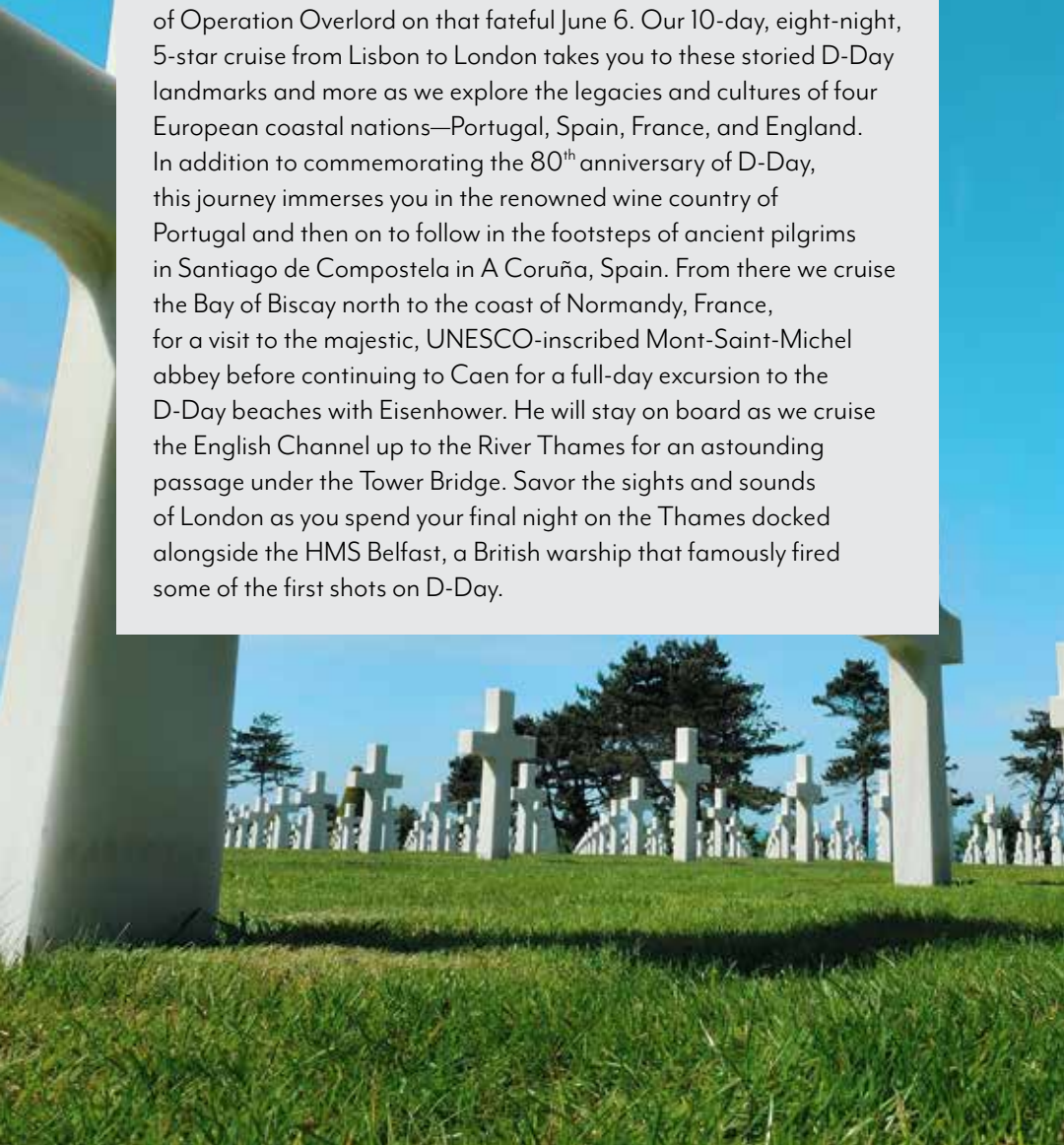

Eighty years ago, Allied forces stormed the beaches of Normandy, France, for an invasion that would change the course of history. DWIGHT DAVID EISENHOWER II

Grandson of General and President Dwight D. Eisenhower, Dwight David Eisenhower II is a noted historian of World War II and the Cold War. His 1986 bestseller, *Eisenhower: At War 1943–1945*, was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in History. Eisenhower received a B.A. in history cum laude from Amherst College. Following graduation, he served in the United States Naval Reserve for three years as an officer on the USS Albany; shortly afterward, he earned his J.D. cum laude from The George Washington University Law School. Today, Eisenhower is Senior Fellow of the Foreign Policy Research Institute and a Public Policy Fellow at the Annenberg School of Communication and the School of Arts and Sciences at the University of Pennsylvania, where he teaches “Communication and the Presidency.”

A WORLD AT WAR: SPIES, ALLIES, AND OPERATION OVERLORD



In the days before President Dwight D. Eisenhower led land, air, and sea forces to victory in one of the largest amphibious invasions in military history, Allied powers in nearby London and the then-occupied France were on high alert. On June 1, 1944, five days before troops stormed Normandy beaches, the BBC sent its first coded message to warn the French resistance of the coming invasion. The next day in London, Prime Minister Winston Churchill—who had wanted to watch the operation code-named OVERLORD from HMS BELFAST—received a letter from King George VI pleading with him not to go. The city had suffered tremendous loss just a few years prior in an aerial German bombing campaign known as The Blitz. The risk, according to the king, was just too high. Meanwhile, secret messages were flying in Lisbon—a notorious hive of spy activity during World War II. Consequently, when nearly 133,000 troops finally landed on the Normandy beaches at 6:30 a.m. on June 6, 1944, Allied countries throughout Europe watched, and waited, for news of a much-needed victory. Our exclusive travel program takes you in the path of this iconic history on the 80th anniversary of D-Day, from Lisbon’s “city of spies” to Caen, the French city that set the stage for the Battle of Normandy, and on to London, where you will spend the night docked on the Thames next to none other than the HMS Belfast. Dwight David Eisenhower II, historian and grandson of President Eisenhower, joins us on a special anniversary tour with onboard lectures and guided walks through the American Military Cemetery, Pointe du Hoc, and Omaha Beach, where an estimated 2,400 Allied soldiers died on a day the world will never forget.

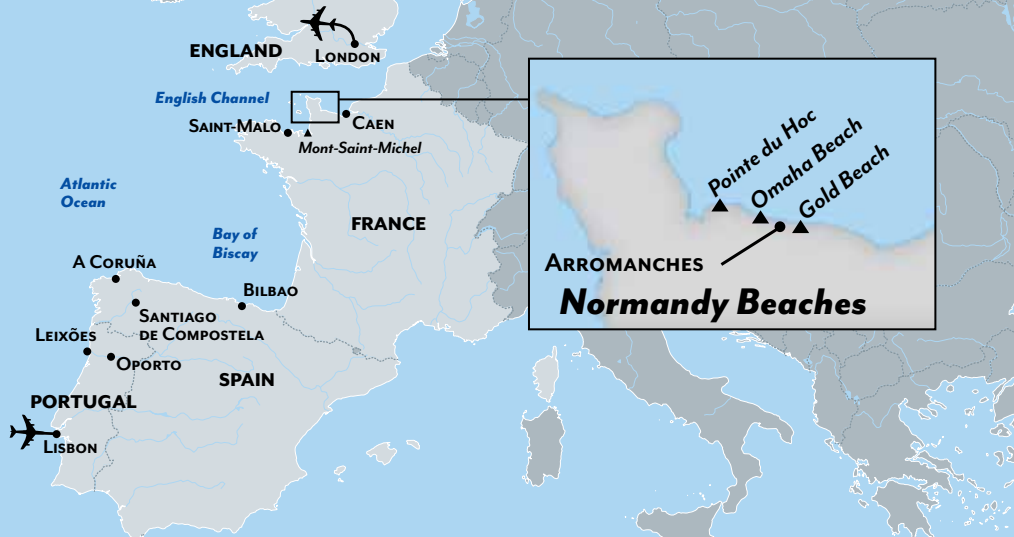

Dock in Leixões and transfer to Oporto, a former Roman outpost and center of port wine trade since the 13th century. The cultural legacy of the Moors finds expression in Oporto's rich architectural details.

Either choose to experience a port and cheese tasting at a local lodge or take a "Medieval Monuments of Oporto" tour.

After lunch, the group will embark on a walking tour of Ribeira, Oporto's historical center, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its living history status. Enjoy the afternoon at leisure before embarking the ship to attend the Captain's Welcome Reception this evening. (B,L,R,D)

A Coruña, Spain, for Santiago de Compostela

Day 4

Visit the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Santiago de Compostela, and stroll along medieval stone streets

Philippe Starck redefined the post-industrial skyline. An afternoon excursion in the city will give you two options for included activities. Choose between touring the Guggenheim's renowned art collection or enjoy a Basque

to the Praza do Obradoiro—flanked by the glorious Romanesque cathedral. As a pilgrimage site since the Middle Ages, the cathedral enshrines the tomb of Saint James and is recognized for its carved Baroque façade, original medieval portico, and Churrigueresque altar. (B,L,D)

Bilbao

Day 5

Frank Gehry's titanium-clad Guggenheim Museum hailed Bilbao's cultural renaissance as modernist marvels from Santiago Calatrava and

cooking demonstration and a panoramic tour of Bilbao. Conclude the day with a guided visit to the old quarter, followed by time at leisure. (B,L,D)

Day 6

Saint-Malo, France, for Mont-Saint-Michel

Day 7

Rising from a tidal plain that appears to be suspended

Mont St. Michel, near Saint-Malo, France



above the sea, the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Mont-Saint-Michel is a sight of soaring spires isolated beyond a stretch of saltwater marsh. This fortified village began as a humble oratory and became a renowned medieval center of learning. Cobblestone streets weave through the village, culminating in the Abbaye du Mont-Saint-Michel, a three-story Gothic masterpiece. Admire the serene cloisters, barrel-roofed réfectoire, and Salle des Hôtes of the 13th-century La Merveille and the magnificent Église Abbatiale. (B,L,D)

Caen for the Normandy Beaches

Day 8

Dock in Caen and make the solemn pilgrimage with David

Eisenhower to the historic Normandy beaches, site of the largest seaborne invasion in history. Following lunch, opt to continue to Arranches to see the remnants of the Mulberry “A” harbor that was taken across the English Channel to support Allied landings on the Normandy beaches or choose to see the 230-foot-long Bayeux Tapestry, which chronicles the Norman Conquest of 1066, or continue to explore the region at leisure. (B,L,D)

Cruising the English Channel/ River Thames, London, England

Day 9

This morning, attend a lecture from Professor Eisenhower on board the ship. Cruise the English Channel across

the Strait of Dover and continue up the River Thames, a memorable passage possible only by small ship. See Britain’s history revealed as you pass the towering skyline and take in monumental views of Greenwich’s Observation Tower, the Tower of London, Norman Foster’s emerald-hued Gherkin, and Renzo Piano’s sky-piercing Shard. Dock overnight alongside a famous D-Day-era warship in view of the Tower Bridge. Attend the Captain’s Farewell Reception this evening. (B,L,R,D)

London/Return to home city

Day 10

Following breakfast, disembark and continue to the London Post-Program or transfer to the airport for your return flight home. (B)

**Paratroops Hit Nazis
In Pre-Dawn Assaults**

SUPREME HEADQUARTERS, ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE, June 6 (AP)—American, British and Canadian troops landed in northern France this morning, launching the greatest overseas military operation in history with word from their supreme commander, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, that "we will accept nothing except full victory" over the German masters of the Continent.

The invasion, which Eisenhower called "a great crusade," was announced at 7:32 A. M. Greenwich mean time (3:32 A. M. Eastern War Time) in this one-sentence communique No. 1:

Under the command of Gen. Eisenhower Allied naval forces supported by strong air forces began landing Allied armies this morning on the northern
