2019 Award Recipients

Francisco Rodriguez '85, M.A. '97

Jerry W. Fielder Award

Dr. Francisco C. Rodriguez, served as UC Davis CAAA Board President, 2000-2002, served on the UC Davis Foundation and was an active member of the Chicano Latino Alumni Association (CLAA). He is currently the chancellor of the Los Angeles Unified Community College District (LACCD), the largest community college district in the United States. He currently serves as Chair of the National Science Foundation Advisory Committee. Dr. Rodriguez is a distinguished scholar in higher education, community development and engagement and a nationally recognized leader and role model in the Latino community.

Heather Young '81

Distinguished Achievement Award

Dr. Young is a nurse leader, educator, scientist and nationally recognized expert in gerontological nursing and rural health care. Heather M. Young is the Dignity Health Dean's Chair for Nursing Leadership and founding dean of the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing at UC Davis. As founding dean, Young led the establishment of the School of Nursing, the development of five new graduate programs in Nursing Science and Health-Care Leadership, the design and construction of the 70,000-square-foot Betty Irene Moore Hall and the formation of a nursing science research program focused on healthy systems and healthy people.

Heidi Jannenga '92

Outstanding Alumna Award

Dr. Heidi Jannenga PT, DPT, ATC/L, is the co-founder and president of WebPT, the country's leading rehab therapy EMR platform for enhancing patient care and fueling business growth. Since the company's launch in 2008, Heidi has guided WebPT through exponential growth. Today, it's the fastest-growing EMR in the country, employing nearly 500 people and serving more than 75,000 therapy professionals at more than 10,000 clinics. Heidi has been recognized as one of Health Data Management's Most Powerful Women in Healthcare IT.

Jim Creighton, M.D. '87

Distinguished Achievement Award

Jim has been a health professional living and working in Africa since the 1980s. Jim joined the Peace Corps in Lesotho, South Africa, before ultimately taking a position in the CDC as the Director of Southern Africa Regional Aids Program. Jim currently resides in Rwanda, where he works in the film industry on a TV show that offers value to the local populations in the areas of health, education and entertainment. Jim founded Akagera Productions, which is supported by the Ministry of Health, to help diminish health-related issues through the use of multi-platform media in the development of a TV series called Mutoni.

Richard Addante, Ph.D. '11

Young Alumnus Award

Dr. Richard J. Addante has accomplished outstanding achievements and contributions since he graduated from UC Davis in 2011 with a PhD in Neuroscience and with a Master Diver & Scientific Research Diver rating from the Bodega Marine diving program. He has completed a very prestigious 3-year post-doctoral fellowship in neuroimaging at UT-Southwestern Medical School, was a faculty member at UT-Dallas, and is now a tenure-track professor at California State University-San Bernardino. He has published several papers which have literally re-written neuroscience and psychology textbooks.
